Property Projects

Pool Heating Project.

We have done extensive work during the holidays to upgrade and install underground piping to the pool area. We are working with the Te Aroha Swimming Club to utilise the school boiler so that the pool swimming season can be extended for our swimmers. We have successfully managed to get grant funding to help with this project and are looking forward to it being completed.

Gym Upgrade.

Plans to upgrade our gym facilities are well underway. Tenders have been called and we are hoping to start the upgrade by the end of this term.

Painting Colour Change

The painting of the Hall and Administration block are nearing completion with considerable positive feedback on the colour change

Security Cameras.

The College is upgrading its security cameras and very soon we will have a much better system in place to keep our staff, students and property safe.
