Dear Parents and Whanau

As you will all be aware information around the national response to the Covid 19 pandemic is moving very fast within New Zealand. In the following update we hope to clarify some of the frequent questions we are being asked and also provide clarity around what we are doing as a school community.

Our in School Response:

- We have upgraded all hygiene processes and expectations in the school for both students and staff
- 2. We have issued all the year 9 students with their chrome books This has been accompanied by an email explaining the conditions of use and a follow up memo in hard copy. Parents need to be very clear about the clauses around wilful damage and ensure students manage these devices well.
- 3. We have checked all students in years 10 and 11 to ensure they have a working chromebook.

- 4. All staff have created google classrooms and have logged their classes onto these in preparation for possible school closures in coming weeks.
- 5. We have sent a detailed NZQA letter home to all senior students and their families to ensure our NCEA students clearly understand how we will operate if we have to close the school.
- 6. We have informed our school community that it is important to keep sick students home
- 7. We are not running assemblies or gatherings for more than 100 people
- 8. We are not running trips where students would have been mixing with other students or the public.
- 9. We have allowed trainings and practices to operate at this stage in the short term.
- 10. The school manual programme on Tuesdays and Fridays is also operating in the short term.
- 11. As a school we will be communicating with families and whanau via email, text, Facebook, the school app and the school website
- 12. We have reminded everyone that only the Ministry of Health can close schools and until we are advised of this all students who are well should be attending school. Any closure notice will be sent as a formal notice to all parents.

We have also met with our fellow primary principals this week to ensure we are all working together to provide a shared community response.

Parents and Whanau can support us by:

- Ensuring access to functional internet connection
- Ensuring that all student and family contact details are up to date and contacting the office if they have changed
- Downloading the school App
- Regularly checking the school Facebook for updates
- Supporting the school with reminders to their students about social distancing and hand washing
