Student instructions for Wednesday 15th April

- 2. Check in with your other teachers for Wednesday through Google Classroom to say hello and to find out their expectations for the week.

- 1. Go to your emails and join your form teacher's Google Classroom then say hello! This is very important as your form teacher will be contacting you and your family during the school week to touch base with you and to make sure that everything is going okay!
- 2. Check in with your Thursday teachers through Google Classroom to say hello and to find out their expectations for the week.

Online support for distance learning

The Ministry has launched its Learning From Home and Ki Te Ao Mārama websites which provide advice and resources to support parents, whānau and teachers. The websites will help early learning centres, schools and kura to develop online learning plans that they can share with their parents and whānau.

The Ministry has set up a Connected Learning Advisory help desk to assist leaders, teachers, kaiako and whānau to make full use of the online environments and resources, as they provide for a continuity of learning for their students and tamariki. CORE Education, which runs the helpdesk, will provide this and other online support from 8am to 5pm on business days.
